Q: Do you have any information on my students' topics?

A: We might! Our focus is on Colorado history, people, places, events, and things, so if your students' topics have a Colorado connection, we may be able to provide important context or primary source materials. Our collection is strongest in materials dating from the 1860s-1940s.

The best way to begin is to check our online Library & Research Center catalog at h-co.org/catalogs to see what we have on a particular topic.

Q: How do I (or my students) access your materials? Are they online?

A: A limited number of our photographs and artifacts are available to view on our online collection at <u>h-co.org/collections</u>. Otherwise, the vast majority of our materials are available for research on-site during library open hours, Wednesday-Saturday 10am-2pm. We always have librarians on duty during open hours to help.

Q: Should I bring my class down for an open research period?

A: Due to staffing constraints and the unique nature of special collections research, we are best equipped to help students on an individual or small-group basis rather than hosting class groups. Contact our Education team to arrange field trips and class museum visits!

Q: Can you provide me with primary source material for a lesson plan or unit?

A: We would love to! Our librarians can work with you to select materials and send scans or copies of materials for your use in class.
